








Guide name **Setting up two displays with build-in docking station**

This guide applies to displays with build-in docking station.

Step	Description	Navigation
<p>Understand the display ports</p>	<p>Ports under the display</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. HDMI 2. DisplayPort-in – This is to be connected to the computer. 3. DisplayPort-out – This is to be connected to the second display 4. USB-C – This is to be connected to the computer to activate port 5, 6 and 7 5. EthernetPort. 6. USB-A – Ordinary USB 7. USB-A – Ordinary USB 	
<p>Connect computer to primary display</p>	<p>To set up two or more displays you must first connect your computer to the primary display.</p>	<p>This is done setting USB-C in port 4 to computer</p> 
<p>Connect the secondary display</p>	<p>The signal must go from display 1 to display. 2</p>	 <p>This cable (Note the slanting side is only in one side) is inserted in port 3 (Displayport-out) in the primary display and connected to port 2 (Displayport-in) in the secondary display.</p>

		<p>Do NOT use an ordinary HDMI-cable (Slanting on both sides).</p> 
<p>Settings on the display</p>	<p>To access the display setting you need to use this button behind the display to navigate. It is located under the right side.</p> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Press in the middle to open start menu 2. Press up for the settings menu 3. Navigate to input and press in the middle to confirm your choice  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Input on the primary display must be USB-C.
<p>Connecting network cable</p>	<p>Network cable must be connected from the plug in the wall to port 5.</p>	
<p>Setting on the computer</p>	<p>You need to set up the computer to find the two displays and organize their correct order</p> <p><i>NOTE! Do not close your laptop until both displays have been found. If you do this, you will pause the computer and the displays.</i></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right-click on your desktop and choose Display settings. 2. Under Multiple displays choose Extend displays. 3. Click Save changes in the blue band thus appearing. <p>You should now be able to move your mouse from one display to another. If not, you need to change the order of your displays.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Still under Display settings, you use your mouse to change the order of the displays as you want. Click Apply.
