




Guide name **Setting up two displays without build-in docking station**

This guide applies to displays with build-in docking station.

Step	Description	Navigation
<p>Understand the display ports</p>	<p>Ports under the display may look like this</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. HDMI 2. DisplayPort-in – This is to be connected to the computer. 3. DisplayPort-out – This is to be connected to the second display 4. USB-C – This is to be connected to the computer to activate port 5, 6 and 7 5. USB-A – Ordinary USB 6. USB-A – Ordinary USB 	<p><i>This is an example:</i></p> 
<p>Connect computer to primary display</p>	<p>To set up two or more displays you must first connect your computer to the primary display.</p>	<p>This is done with a display cable from your computer</p>  <p>To DisplayPort-in</p>  <p>Note the slanting side is only in one side. Do NOT use an ordinary HDMI-cable (Slanting on both sides).</p>

Connect the secondary display	The signal must go from display 1 to display. 2	The next display cable is inserted in Displayport- out in the primary display and connected to Displayport- in in the secondary display.
Settings on the display	It varies from display to display how you access the settings menu. Typically, there will be buttons under the display which allows you to navigate	Common to the displays is that you have to enter Input and DisplayPort . Under DisplayPort , select DisplayPort 1.2 .
Setting on the computer	<p>You need to set up the computer to find the two displays and organize their correct order</p> <p><i>NOTE! Do not close your laptop until both displays have been found. If you do this, you will pause the computer and the displays.</i></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right-click on your desktop and choose Display settings. 2. Under Multiple displays choose Extend displays. 3. Click Save changes in the blue band thus appearing. <p>You should now be able to move your mouse from one display to another. If not, you need to change the order of your displays.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Still under Display settings, you use your mouse to change the order of the displays as you want. Click Apply.
